OCTOBER 7, 2023 6:00-10:00 PM To say that the ARToberfest was a tremendous success is a tremendous understatement. Sponsorships totaled approximately \$ 31,000. We sold or offered to sponsors 296 presale entry tickets, sold 70 walk-up tickets, and had to turn people away. Drink ticket sales are estimated at \$3000. We 'licked the platter

clean' in terms of food, beer and wine; the craft breweries were emptied out and thrilled with the crowd size and tastings. We sold 235 pieces of donated art for \$2670, which means that not only are our closets neater, but treasured art has found a new loving home. Several casual strollers stopped to hear the music from the Brassworks Band and as you can see from the pictures, it was a beautiful evening of art, beer and wine, German inspired food and FUN that spilled outside of our beloved Julia Morgan RAM building. The crowd included LOTS of people who were young and new to Art Alliance/RAM events. WIN, WIN, WIN!!

ARTIST STATEMENT

"For me, I feel a deep sense of responsibility to create pieces that eloquently speak to the soul and convey powerful messages.

"I have always said "that my most important goal as an artist is to make profound aesthetic art statements that are ethnically rooted and at the same time, arouse spiritual emotions in the viewers. I want to tell stories in my art that mirror the Black Experience while maintaining a unique and personal artistic style; therefore, I am constantly developing my own art language, the "Bibbs" language, which promises to take the viewer on an extraordinary journey and leave them with a distinctive and unforgettable experience."

Charles Bibbs Exhibition Dates: November 3, 2023 - March 10, 2024



This landmark exhibition, filling three galleries of the Riverside Art Museum, presents a range of works from Charles Bibbs' personal art collection as well as the artist's own original paintings and drawings. Through *Sacred Spaces* Bibbs shares his life-long love of contemporary art and the creative values that guide his own work.

Several of Bibbs' iconic works celebrating the black community are presented throughout the Members' Gallery and the Bobbie Powell and Devean Galleries. Highlights include the totemic work *Power & Glory*, the wistful *Bagman* paintings, and a majestic series honoring Black women.

Among the pieces from Bibbs' personal collection are classic humanist works by Samella Lewis and John Biggers, vibrant compositions by Synthia Saint James, and works of gentle spirituality by Frank Howell. All these artists have been part of Bibbs' development as an artist, advocate, and self-validating entrepreneur, and have helped shape Bibbs' unique vision and perspective.

Through *Sacred Spaces*, Bibbs' seeks to not only share this artistic journey but send a message about the power of art in everyday life. He believes in a vital connection between the art that people see in public spaces and the lives they live in the spaces they inhabit every day. *Sacred Spaces* brings together these concepts in the hope that visitors will experience a connection with art that they take back into the sacred spaces of their own homes.

This deep acknowledgement of the link between one's own experience and a piece of art, and how that can be reflected and expanded on in one's own home, is a living pathway that Bibbs aims to spotlight in this carefully curated installation of his works.

Hold the date for the 9th Annual Riverside Art Market


Saturday, April 13th, 2024 10 am – 4 pm

Featured Artist Pauline Geerlings NWS



A Riverside artist from the 1960s to the early 2000s, Pauline stated, "As an early artist, I have been a participant and an observer of the evolving nature of my paintings. From years of very early representational works, my desire to create has taken me into the uncharted waters of attempting to project feelings, memories, and moods into my work."

In the 1960s and 70s Pauline studied watercolor painting with OK Harry and Rex Brandt as well as photography and ceramics at RCC. She became a signature member of the National Watercolor Society during this time. As a mid-century painter Pauline made her most iconic work in oil and watercolor. She had solo and group exhibitions at the Edward Dean Museum and the Riverside Art Center (as RAM was then called).

Always involved in the community, Pauline was active in Art Alliance supporting RAM. In the 1980s Pauline was a founding member of Studio 7 at the Mission Plaza apartments next to Joanna Mersereau's studio. Other members included Sharon Wolfe, Ruth Pauline, and Ella Alvarez. These were the early days of art pop up shops, and the events and parties were hugely influential to a younger generation, including Sharon Kauffman and Mark Schooley who shaped the Riverside Community Arts Association at the Life Arts building, where Pauline had a studio in the the late 80s and early 90s alongside others, including Terry Long, Roberta Jacka, and Tim Carney. Influenced by the youthful energy of this hive of creativity, Pauline began experimenting with collage, handmade paper, and acrylics.

In the 90s and 2000s Pauline shared studio space with John Dingler and Lee Tusman in the quonset hut on Blaine, and there she made much of her last large scale paintings. Her work turned to internal, psychological themes as she became influenced by British painters including David Leapman and Francis Bacon, and her work became darker as it reflected her changing personality due to the onset of Alzheimers. She exhibited in group shows in Riverside, including Connie Ransom's gallery, The Art Works, and RAM's show, "Creative Expression, a Lifelong Pursuit."

Pauline passed away in 2021.


HOSPITALITY

A big thank you to all the help with vegan dishes for our first speaker in September. We will be having another vegan speaker in November. A dish can be as easy as salsa or more complicated....up to the maker!! Remember to watch for sign up inyour email about 2 weeks prior to our meetings. Here is a definition of vegan diet for those who aren't aware. I will remind everyone again in November. Thanks!

Vegan and vegetarian diets both exclude meat and seafood. Vegan diets go a step further, though, by also nixing every other food of animal origin. So, in addition to avoiding meat, vegans steer clear of <u>dairy products</u>, <u>eggs</u>, and <u>honey</u>. Additionally, vegan foods never contain any <u>byproducts of animal agriculture</u>, such as lard, <u>whey</u>, or <u>gelatin</u>.
