ARToberfest. Several important goals were met! First of all, we made our projected profit



plus some—close to \$30,000. Secondly, we expanded the age span of our audience. Many people have commented on how much fun it was to see young and older guests, happily mixing and enjoying the event. Finally, we sold a LOT of artwork—thanks to your donations! Because of our reasonable prices, many guests happily took home treasures. All in all, ARToberfest was a big success! At our wrap-up meeting on October 24<sup>th</sup> the committee made the following positive comments about the event:

- The ambiance and décor of the event (including stringing white lights across the lawn) was terrific. People seemed to enjoy themselves!
- The food was terrific (thanks Emmanuelle Reynolds & Tami Fleming-Maio)!

Artist Biography



Gray received her undergraduate degree from Ontario College of Art in Toronto, and her MFA from Rhode Island School of Design in Providence, RI. Her work has been exhibited at Heller Gallery in New York City, Urban Glass in New York, and most reccently in solo shows at the Craft Contemporary (formerly the Craft and Folk Art Museum) in Los Angeles and thce Toledo Museum of Art. Her work has been reviewed in the New York Observer.com, Artforum.com and in the cLA Times. Images of her glasswork have also appeared in the New York Times Design magazine. In 2017, she was the recipient of the Libenský/ Brychtová Award from the Pilchuck Glass School for her artistic andc educational contributions to the field; she has also been inducted into the College of Fellows of the American Craft Council and the Corning Museum of Glass. Gray can be seen in the ongoing Netflix series *Blown Away* as the Resident Evaluator.

Her work can be found in the collections of the Corning Museum of Glass, the Toledo Museum of Art, the Asheville Museum of Art and the Museum of Glass in Tacoma, WA, among others. Gray has written about glass, curated and juried multiple exhibitions, and has taught workshops around the world. Currently, she lives in Los Angeles,



CA, and is a Professor of Art at California State University, San Bernardino. www.katherine-gray.com


### r.mike nichols Enter an opportunity drawing for Art Alliance General Meetings!!

# HOSPITALITY

A big thank you to all the help for offerings during Charles Bibb's talk program in October. We will be having another vegan speaker in November. A vegan dish can be as easy as salsa, hummus, fruit plate or veggie kabobs ....up to the maker!! Here is a definition of vegan diet for those who aren't aware. No speaker meeting in December (Holiday Lucch) and in January we will have our annual potluck lunch. Watch for news if you are to bring a dessert ot a salad.

Vegan and vegetarian diets both exclude meat and seafood. Vegan diets go a step further, though, by also nixing every other food of animal origin. Additionally, vegan foods never contain any <u>byproducts of animal</u> <u>agriculture</u>, such as lard, <u>whey</u>, or <u>gelatin</u>.


### **UPCOMING ARTIST EVENTS**

Artist Denise Kraemer is a very versatile, well known and respected member of the Inland Empire arts community. She is a professional curator, a juror, an educator and an exciting artist in her own right.

Karen Ruth Karlsson is a painter and printmaker whose workaims to bring structure and order to a chaotic world. Growing up within the grid that is New York City informs her geometric abstractions rendered in layers of

wax, resin and pigment. Karlsson's encaustic paintings, monoprints, collagraphs, and mixed media works have been curated into group and solo exhibits across the country and can be found in the permanent collection of the The Chaffey Community Museum of Art.

Hello Everyone. I wanted to take this opportunity invite all of you to tmy upcoming solo art show "Lost Child". I haven't shared a collection of work with the public in nearly ten years so I'm deeply grateful for this opportunity to exhibit and share this with all of you. This series of paintings explores the concepts of being raised by Emotionally Immature Parents in an unhealthy household and the effects that childhood traumas continue to have in my adulthood. Full disclosure, most of these works are centered around grief, substance abuse, suicidal ideation, futility, sickness, death, and finding peace with these realities.

I'm also happy to be sharing the space with two very talented artists: alexa vazquez and Estrella Martinez. "girlhood" by alexa vazquez is a collection of photographs that explores and confronts. The idea of reclaiming one's "girlhood". Revisiting innocence and femininity portrayed by "this white dress". Reclaiming one's own body after feeling as though it was "taken" from you long ago.

"Give me back my girlhood it was mine first".

"That One Time" by Estrella Martinez is an interactive multimedia installation that recreates childhood and adolescent experiences of joyful gathering.
