





Featured Artist - Lucy Heyming

The featured artist for November and December is Lucy Heyming. Two things inspired Lucy to begin painting in 2004, her love of nature and of the watercolor medium. She originally took a beginning watercolor class at Riverside Art Museum. After this, in 2005, she began classes with local water color artist, David Musser at UCR Extension. With his encouragement she continued to paint and put her paintings in local art festivals and RAM. She won an Honorable mention in a show in Fallbrook and a second place in the Nevada Watercolor Society annual members show in 2019. Besides watercolors, Lucy

took print making classes with Ron Pokrasso at RAM for four years.

Beginning in 2010, she started a new art venture with her friend Siri Khalsa to create repurposed glass and ceramic art for the home and garden. For four years they trained themselves in this art form, and then in 2014 they started Garden Glass Etc. They sold all sized pieces, from tiny to



extra-large from their studio in Riverside, and at art festivals throughout Southern California. This continued for five years until the barn which housed their studio burnt down in 2019, closing the business. With more time on her hands, Lucy went back to her watercolors with renewed energy.

Among her favorite subjects are flowers, succulents, insects, vegetables and landscapes from her hometown, and the surrounding area.

Don't forget about our Riverside-themed collection.










TREASURER'S TALK
