

PROGRAMS

November Speaker: Jonathan Godinez



The featured speaker for the November Art Alliance general meeting will be **Jonathan Godinez**.

Jonathan is an interdisciplinary Mexican-American artist born and raised in Tijuana, Mexico. At the age of eleven, he and his family moved to Riverside California in search of a better future. He attended Norco and Riverside City College for his foundational studies before transferring to California State University, Long Beach, where he earned his bachelor's degree in Studio Arts in 2021. **Jonathan** continued his art education and earned a Master of Fine Arts degree from Claremont Graduate University in 2024. Presently, **Jonathan** is teaching at Scripps College in Claremont, CA.

Jonathan's interest in art was first sparked by the vibrant graffiti murals that decorated the streets of his childhood neighborhood. This early exposure fostered a deep appreciation for street art, which continues to influence much of his work today. While studying at Cal State Long Beach, he was introduced to woodworking and sculpture, discovering a passion for creating with his hands that rivaled his love for drawing and painting. This newfound interest led him to explore 3D modeling and printing, where he found he could design intricate sculptures on the computer and bring them to life as physical 3D prints. Halfway through his master's degree, Jonathan decided to pause his painting work to focus on digital 3d scanning and modeling, resulting in an impressive collection of 3D-printed sculptures that added up to his Thesis.

Michael J. Elderman first knew he might be a good photographer when his aunt, who never liked anything, told him she admired a portrait he had taken of her with his Brownie Hawkeye camera when he was 11 years old.

Jump ahead to **Michael** in his 30s, starting a photography business with a friend, but always keeping an artistic component going as well. His first exhibit, at the Inland Empire Gallery in 1978, was *Wedding Nights and Other Fantasies*—semi-nude portraits of friends that celebrated **Michael** himself getting married that year. In 1982, a solo show of his series of portraits of creative friends and others appeared at the Riverside Art Museum. Shortly after that, he had a solo show at the Santa Barbara Museum of Art of his Xmas à la SoCal work—humorous and wry photos of how Southern Californians treated Christmas in a warm climate.

In this mix was a series of portraits of writers done at UCR and elsewhere, shown at Back to the Grind and on permanent exhibit in the halls of the Creative Writing Department at UCR. Next came The World's Playground—photos which darkly portrayed the transition to casino gambling in **Michael's** hometown of Atlantic City,

NJ. It showed at the Atlantic City Museum in New Jersey, as well as in group shows in Everett, Washington, and Riverside.

Finally, two solo exhibits of **Michael's** Fox Theater work, based on his book about the restoration of Riverside's Fox Theater, showed at the Riverside Art Museum and the Brandstater Gallery at La Sierra University. His Urban Dance Riverside work began in 2010 or so and continues into the present. Images have been shown at Division 9 Gallery, RCAA Gallery, The Makery in Los Angeles, and several others.

Michael is known for his commercial and art photography in Riverside as "The Eyes of Riverside."

IN MEMORIUM



Beverly Wingate Maloof, Art Alliance President 1975 - 1976

Beverly Wingate Maloof, who spent decades protecting Riverside's historic buildings and natural landscapes died on November 6 at the age of 94.

Maloof helped save the Mission Inn from demolition as a founding member of the Mission Inn Foundation. She participated in campaigns for Measures C and R, which regulated growth in the historic Arlington Heights Citrus area and along Victoria Avenue.

"Beverly was always part of the Riverside community growing up," said Riverside Mayor Patricia Lock Dawson. "I knew her name, and she was always kind and an inspiration to me as a mother and business owner."

As founding president of the Riverside Land Conservancy, Maloof worked to protect open spaces throughout the city. The organization's Wingate Maloof Award for effective environmental engagement honors her legacy.

She served as past president of the Riverside Art Alliance, supporting the Riverside Art Museum in its 1929 Julia Morgan building. In the 1970s, she chaired restoration efforts for the Museum of Riverside's Heritage House.

Maloof founded Shelter West Realty, operating from a historic Riverside home where the backyard hosted numerous nonprofit events. She performed for over 50 years with The Why Nots, a folk music group of eight women who met weekly.

"Beverly was a model for women going into business because she was determined to be of service to her clients and the community around her," said friend Connie Ransom.

In 1989, Maloof became the first woman inducted into Riverside Sunrise Rotary. She received the Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce Athena Award in 1994 for creating leadership opportunities for women.

Born in Lincoln, Nebraska, in 1931, Maloof cherished childhood memories of running through grass and climbing elm trees, which inspired her lifelong dedication to preserving nature. She first met woodworker Sam Maloof in 1958 at the Los Angeles County Fair, ordering a table that began their decades-long friendship. They married in 2001.

Following their marriage, she helped complete the relocation of the historic Maloof home to Rancho Cucamonga to make way for the 210 freeway. There she designed the Maloof Discovery Garden, demonstrating water-wise landscaping. She served on the board of the

Sam and Alfreda Maloof Foundation and as a trustee of the California Botanical Garden in Claremont.

She is survived by her son, Todd Wingate, and his partner, Steven Cason.

"My mother's commitment to the Maloof Foundation was an example of how she lived her life—always in service of the greater community," said Todd.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer's Talk - November 2025

Attached are the September financials, the first of our new fiscal year. We began the year with \$26,500 and end the month with \$20,800.

Income reflects the Membership transfer of \$7500 (credit card payments) and the remainder ARToberfest sponsorships. The majority of the expenses are the \$15,000 donation to RAM (\$10,000 proceeds from Art Market and 5,000 for the Ophelia Valdez-Yeager Plaque), the beginning of ARToberfest expenses, and the printing of the Directory.

While ARToberfest has not been reconciled and the final amount we earned for RAM still in process, I can say that it was a successful event on many levels. Congratulations to all of you who sponsored, donated, and volunteered to make this another amazing Art Alliance event.
